Connectives

A **CLAUSE** is a very simple sentence.

A **CONNECTIVE** joins two **CLAUSES** (or simple sentences) to make a **COMPLEX SENTENCE**.

Take the three clauses and join them together using an appropriate connective.

- 1a) Sam ate pickled onions.
 - 1b) Jess watched him.
 - 1c) Sam started to choke on the pickled onions.
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- 2a) Terry wanted to go to the park.
 - 2b) Andrea did not want to go.

 - 5b) She had five big pigs.
 - 5c) She lived in Winchester with her brother Ned.
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- 6a) Pete had an apple.
 - 6b) Jane didn't like apples.
 - 6c) Amanda preferred bananas.
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- 7a) Tina was a cleaner.
 - 7b) Tina had a vacuum cleaner and a mop.
 - 7c) Tina liked singing when she worked.
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- 8a) An alien spaceship landed in the garden.
 - 8b) They zapped my memory.
 - 8c) I can't tell you anything else about it.
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
